MAKING A TITLE VI COMPLAINT

Any person who believes he/she has been subjected to discrimination in the delivery of or access to public transportation services on the basis of race, color, or national origin, may file a complaint with the <u>Owen County Public Transit</u>. Such complaint must be filed in writing with <u>OCPT</u> no later than <u>180</u> days after the alleged discrimination.
